Enthusiastic volunteers from member hotels and vendor companies offered a day of improvements, donations and community pride during SHA's 10th annual community service day, Saturday, September 10.

More than 240 volunteers completed projects at the Oak Park Community Center and McClatchy Park, as well as at a community garden. In addition, volunteers worked on projects at the Alchemist Community Development Corporation, American Legion High School, Father Keith B. Kenny School (K-8), Food Literacy Center, Habitat for Humanity-ReStore, Kiwanis Family House, Lutheran Social Services of Northern California, Next Move, Oak Park Sol, Oak Ridge Elementary School, River City Food Bank, Ronald McDonald House, Sacramento Building Healthy Communities—The HUB, Sacramento Food Bank and Family Services/Oak Park Campus, Sacramento High School/Edible Sac High and Wind Youth Services. Volunteers also created original greeting cards for military veterans; the cards will be distributed by Volunteers of America.

"We are delighted that our volunteer teams participate each year to assist so many partner organizations in our community," said Teresa Stephenson, executive director of the Sacramento Hotel Association. HYATT REGENCY SACRAMENTO

SUITE CHANGES AND RENOVATIONS

It was a busy time for changes and renovations at the Hyatt Regency this past spring. Here's a quick recap of what occurred:

Regency Club - The Club was moved from the 10th floor to the 12th floor to the Grand Terrace Suite (#1200), where former Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger previously lived. The Regency Club is open Monday through Friday and serves continental breakfast in the morning and hors d'oeuvres in the evening. It features a large outdoor terrace with spectacular views of



room table, two sitting areas, an oversized bathroom and views of the Capitol.

the Capitol. It is available on weekends for intimate catered events for up to 50 people. The former Regency Club was converted into one of the hotel's standard Park Capitol Suites.

Presidential Suite (#1400) – The Presidential Suite was renovated from top to bottom. It features a dining room table, two sitting areas, an oversized bathroom and views of the Capitol.

Governors Suites (#1302 & #1342) - The old Governor's Suite—which originally was the General Manager's apartment when the hotel opened—was divided into two VIP Suites. Each suite features a king-sized bed and separate living room, with views of the Capitol.

With the transition, the Hyatt Regency gained two additional rooms, making Hyatt Regency the largest hotel in the city (505 rooms).

ELECTRIC CHARGING STATION RIBBON (HOSE) CUTTING

The downtown Hyatt Regency Sacramento has been very busy with sustainability projects. Leveraging a partnership with Tesla, which encourages "Destination Charging" to promote electric vehicle adoption, Hyatt has completed the installation of a massive charging infrastructure, making it the largest such installation in the city of Sacramento.

As part of National Drive Electric Week 2016 (September 10-18), members of the press, local elected officials and those involved in the electric conservation community were invited to attend a Press Conference and Ribbon (Hose) Cutting on September 14 on the 5th floor of the parking garage at the Hyatt Regency Sacramento.

The Hyatt celebrated the installation of 26

Level-2 electric charging stations—six Tesla-dedicated and 20 ClipperCreek, which are available to both hotel guests and the general public who park in the hotel garage. There is no additional cost to charge vehicles beyond the regular cost to self-park or valet.

Seed funding for the project was provided by Tesla under the Hyatt partnership agreement. Hotel owners, Capitol Regency LLC, provided the remaining \$125,000 investment.

In addition to viewing the charging areas, attendees were invited to tour the hotel to see other conservation efforts that include "smart" thermostats, room and door sensors, and stationary battery packs. The Hyatt partnered with GridRabbit and SMUD on the installation of "smart" thermostats and motion and door sensors throughout the hotel, and is nearing completion of a commercial-scale stationary battery installation. These projects, individually and combined, significantly reduce electrical demand during peak usage hours. The Hyatt is already diverting 56% of waste from landfills via recycling and composting, has installed low-flow water devices throughout, and is utilizing LEDs to reduce electrical and heat loads.

THE HOTEL BAR

We've all said it, "I'll be at the hotel bar." Well, now The Hotel Bar really exists at the Residence Inn Downtown at Capitol Park, at the corner of 15th and L Streets.

The bar originally opened is 2008 as 3 Fires on the street-level of the

Residence Inn Downtown. The rebranding and renovation of the bar space started July 1. The Hotel Bar opened late August 2016.

It features a '50s, '60s and '70s atmosphere with large couches in bright colors, leather ottomans and rotary telephones. With its two 13-foot projector screens, the bar is hosting monthly classic movie nights with a themed menu to go with that month's film.

General Manager Shelly Moranville and her team worked with Fuel Creative Group on the bar's rebranding. From a distance the new logo appears to read "The HOT L Bar."

The Hotel Bar's menu includes charcuterie boards and small plates such as truffle fries and short rib tacos. Larger portions include a Cajun shrimp pasta plate, grilled barbecue salmon salad, and the Triple B Burger.
